
London Sports Trust aims to inspire positive change to disadvantaged Londoners through the power of sport and to provide training, support and guidance to improve their life outcomes.

Founded in 1894, Southwark Diocesan Welcare ('Welcare') is a registered charity providing practical and emotional support for disadvantaged children/young people up to the age of 13 and their families from five centres across South London and East Surrey.

We help children who are struggling to develop their reading and writing levels for a variety of reasons and who are up to 24 months behind age-related expectations. This means they risk getting 'left behind' educationally as a result and have often begun completely disengaging from mainstream education by the time they start accessing our support.

Manchester Youth Zone provides a unique safe place for young people aged from 6 - 19, up to 25 with additional needs, from across Manchester.

With a wealth of sport and creative activities, MYZ currently welcomes almost 1,000 young people each week and we work to raise our members aspirations and equip them with the tools to increase their confidence, build positive relationships and add something back to their own community.







£20,000 for two years



Yes Futures is a multi award-winning charity which exists to empower the most disadvantaged young people to make ambitious choices and realise their potential. Through developing their confidence, resilience and life skills students find success both in and out of the classroom.

The William Wates Foundation is enabling 250 disadvantaged young people to benefit from the life-changing impact of our programmes.

With this additional funding, we are excited to be able to expand our reach further and move closer to a future where all young people are confident, resilient and lead fulfilling lives.





£24,000 over three years



Youth Adventure Trust (YAT) take Year 7 to 9 pupils from Swindon and the Wiltshire area on a series of adventure camps and day activities that take place over 3 years.

YAT aim to help the young people they support by introducing them to outdoor adventure with a combination of outdoor residential adventure camps and day activities over a 3 school year period. Through multiple touch points the young people are given hope, confidence and skills to face their personal challenges which are often considerable.





£8,980 for one year



Small Green Shoots is a innovative youth-led charity that champions disadvantaged young people, providing opportunities and training for the creative industries. We believe that art is essential to young people and a great motivator helping them have positive futures.

Our ethos "Educations through Stealth" engages NEET young people, who we empower to lead, learn a range of transferable skills and gain a network that will help them in the next steps of their development. Our "Young Shoots" programme provides access to services, secondments and practical workplace training to support their careers.










£120,000 over three years



West London is one of the most unequal areas in the UK and many children living our 'zone' are at risk of developing issues like crime, unemployment, and poor mental health.

At West London Zone, we aim to end the effects of generational inequality in one community. We believe the only way to achieve this – and to ensure our impact is sustainable – is to work from within the community itself. This means that we work with local schools, charities, and councils to identify children who are not well served by existing provision and are at risk of negative outcomes without early intervention.







£15,0000 over one year



Redthread empowers young people to overcome challenges they face in adolescence, including involvement in youth violence or gangs, poor emotional wellbeing or inequalities caused by disadvantage.

We embed trauma-informed youth services in health settings, using them as 'teachable, reachable moments'. Redthread youth workers walk alongside young people as they navigate systems, statutory services and support them to value their own strengths and fulfil their potential.
